


Among its best known contributions are the discovery and development of the birth control pill, the pioneering work that made *in vitro* fertilization possible and the first systematic laboratory study of the anti-tumor actions of tamoxifen, an anti-estrogen drug that has subsequently revolutionized treatment of breast cancer.

Initially an independent research institute, the Worcester Foundation for Biomedical Research merged with the University of Massachusetts Medical School in 1997. Today, the Worcester Foundation is devoted to the support of basic biomedical research of the combined research enterprise, and to the education and training of tomorrow's scientists.


Poised on the threshold of a new millennium, the Worcester Foundation is entering a new and exciting chapter in its evolution.

It was a wonderful year in the life of the Worcester Foundation for Biomedical Research.

Thanks to the vision and generosity of several major benefactors-Mr. Robert W. Booth, the late H. Arthur Smith and the trustees of his foundation and Dr. Vitold Arnett—three endowed positions were created at the University of Massachusetts Medical School through the Worcester Foundation. These positions (and their faculty awardees) are: the George F. Booth Chair of Basic Sciences (George B. Witman III, PhD, professor of cell biology); the H. Arthur Smith Chair for Cancer Research (Richard B. Vallee, PhD, professor of cell biology); and the Vitold Arnett Professorship of Cell Biology (Thoru Pederson, PhD, professor of biochemistry & molecular biology).

A medical school's ability to offer endowed positions to its best and brightest research faculty is so very important, both to retain its stars and recruit the best talent. The number of endowed chairs and professorships at UMMS has grown from four to 16 between 1997 and 1999 alone, thanks in part to the benefactors of the Worcester Foundation. The Foundation also created six new postdoctoral fellowships, enabling young investigators to get their careers started and new ideas to flourish.

With major support from the Fannie E. Rippel Foundation and others, including the Aldus C. Higgins Foundation, the George F. and Sybil H. Fuller Foundation, the Thomas Anthony Pappas Charitable Foundation, the Elizabeth Taylor Fessenden Foundation, the J. Irving England and Jane L. England Charitable Trust and the Margaret Sherman Trust, the Worcester Foundation has helped establish a nuclear magnetic resonance imaging facility that will help transform research into new patient treatments. With this tool, we can study the structure and function of enzymes and proteins in order to develop more efficiently new drug therapies to fight diseases such as AIDS, sickle cell anemia, and breast and prostate cancer.

For two years now, the Worcester Foundation Board of Trustees has awarded grants of approximately \$33,000 each as seed money for the most promising new research projects at UMMS. Nineteen grants totaling over \$625,000 have been awarded so far. These monies are raised through the Annual Research Fund, including the Hudson Hoagland Society. This initiative has proved to be a valuable

catalyst in helping our investigators obtain further federal funding; in fact, those funded in the program's first year have garnered some \$3.5 million in National Institutes of Health (NIH) grants to date. Our goal is to grow the Annual Research Fund in order to award more seed grants in the future.

With more than \$93 million in total annual NIH funding for research, UMMS today is emerging as an institution of national distinction. The key to sustaining this momentum is through the growth of our research program. By adding talented faculty and strengthening our centers of research excellence, we can fuel remarkable discoveries that improve patient care and, ultimately, cure disease. I thank all of you who share this vision.



Pederson receives international prize

In Praque in the summer, Thoru Pederson, PhD, the Vitold Arnett Professor of Cell Biology and director of the Worcester Foundation, was awarded the Bernhard Medal. The honor recognizes outstanding scientific contributions to the study of the cell nucleus and was bestowed during the 16th International Workshop on the Cell Nucleus at a symposium of which Dr. Pederson was the keynote speaker.

New director of Office for Research

John L. Sullivan, MD, professor of pediatrics, pathology, and molecular genetics & microbiology, was named director of the Office for Research. In addition to heading the Office, which assists more than 250 researchers. Dr. Sullivan works with the chancellor and his staff on all research matters. Priorities include the development of a clinical trials office, establishment of a scientific research council and renovation of research facilities in the basic and clinical science wings on campus.

Program in Gene Function and Expression

Green, MD, PhD, professor of biochemistry & molecular biology and Howard Hughes Medical Investigator, has begun recruiting investigators for the Program, which will be housed in the new research laboratory building.

Chair of Medicine appointed

Robert W. Finberg, MD, was named professor and chair of the Department of Medicine at UMMS. Formerly professor of medicine at Harvard Medical School and chief of the Infectious Disease Program in the Department of Adult Oncology at the Dana-Farber Cancer Institute, Dr. Finberg pursues research that links the mechanisms of infectious disease with the causes of and cures for cancer. He is presently principal or co-principal investigator for six research studies.

Trustee Jordan honored as Diana. **Princess of Wales Professor**

British native V. Craiq Jordan, PhD, DSc, a trustee of the Worcester Foundation and professor of cancer pharmacology at Northwestern University, was named the Diana, Princess of Wales Professor of Cancer Research at Northwestern. Presented in accordance with the wishes of Diana's family, the chair is the only one of its kind to be bestowed. As a visiting research fellow at the Foundation from 1972 to 1974. Dr. Jordan completed early studies on the anti-estrogen effects of the chemical tamoxifen, a drug that has been hailed as one of the most significant therapies in the last 20 years for treating estrogendependent breast cancer.

Edward Ginns, MD, PhD, was appointed executive director of the Irving S. and Betty Brudnick Neuropsychiatric Research Institute, a facility dedicated to researching the causes, treatment and prevention of mental disorders, and to training basic and clinical

researchers. Dr. Ginns, an internationally renowned neuroscientist and geneticist, comes to Worcester from a position as chief of the Clinical Neuroscience Branch at the National Institute of Mental Health in Bethesda, Maryland.

Construction gets underway

UMMS officially broke ground for the construction of the new research laboratory building, scheduled for a fall 2001 opening. Chancellor and Dean Aaron Lazare was joined by University President William M. Bulger and over 100 friends and city, state and University officials. Nancy and Robert Feldman of West Newton and John and Linda Nelson of Worcester were introduced at the ceremony as co-chairs of the capital campaign to raise an estimated \$33 million in private donations needed to support the building's construction.

Beyond Imagining the Possibilities: The Annual Research Fund

The trustees of the Worcester Foundation this year awarded grants totaling \$327,722 for promising, innovative research projects at the University of Massachusetts Medical School.

Ten research projects were funded from a field of 68 candidates with monies raised through the Annual Research Fund. The projects are in areas related to, among others, repair of tissue injury; the identification of new targets for antibiotics; spinal cord injuries and multiple sclerosis; new treatments and preventions for infectious diseases; gene therapy; cancer prevention; and HIV/AIDS.

This is the second year in which the Worcester Foundation has allocated unrestricted funds to provide seed support for promising new investigations. The generosity of the many donors who contribute to the Annual Research Fund, including the members of the Hudson Hoagland Society, enable the Worcester Foundation to increase its support of start-up research, providing invaluable assistance where federal monies are often unavailable.

The Annual Research Fund

A Step Toward New Therapies

When a disease such as multiple sclerosis (MS) or a spinal cord injury destroys myelin, the insulating material wrapped around the nerve fibers of the brain and spinal cord, signals transmitted through the central nervous system (CNS) are slowed, garbled or blocked.

Transplanting Schwann cells—the cells that lay down the myelin sheath around nerve fibers—from a patient's peripheral nervous system into the CNS has been proposed as a therapy for MS and spinal cord injuries. Stephen Lambert, PhD, UMMS professor of cell biology, is applying a Worcester Foundation Annual Research Fund grant to work in this area.

"Although transplantation studies in animals have shown promise for this therapy, an *in vitro* system to study and

manipulate the interaction of Schwann cells and central nervous system axons [nerve fibers] hasn't been established," Dr. Lambert explained. In his lab, Lambert is establishing a co-culture system that can be used to determine whether Schwann cells are able to myelinate CNS nerve fibers in vitro. Next, he'll use this co-culture system to learn if Schwann cells can distinguish between myelinated and non-myelinated CNS axons and, ultimately, whether they can correctly stimulate the formation of nodes

that help to transmit electrical signals through the CNS, and recover function.

"This work is crucial to assessing the suitability of future transplantation therapies involving Schwann cells, and for developing drugs and techniques

that may enhance these therapies," Lambert said. "The pilot nature of this project, however, doesn't lend itself to funding from the usual sources. But the Worcester Foundation grant allows me to develop this important work independently and, it's hoped, to an extent where it could merit NIH funding."

A Path to Correcting Genetic Defects

Rapid advances in molecular biology have made the repair of genetic defects by transferring normal genes into mutant cells a clinical reality. This procedure, known as gene therapy, is applicable to any type of cell. Lymphocytes, or white blood cells, frequently have genetic defects that cause immunodeficiencies, such as those in children who must live in isolation chambers (the "bubble boy") and who have AIDSlike pathology.

One focus of research in the UMMS lab of Madelyn R. Schmidt, PhD, is the development of gene transfer techniques that can be used to correct these types of genetic defects. Gene therapy, however, must first be modeled in animals, usually mice, and shown to be safe and effective before human trials can begin.

"Grant support from the Worcester Foundation has enabled our laboratory to characterize a new mouse model, called a 'transgenic,' that is a powerful tool in the study of gene transfer and function in normal cells," explained Dr. Schmidt, professor of molecular genetics & microbiology.

Transgenic mice are born from fertilized eggs injected with DNA that the resulting mouse usually absorbs. This expansion of genes allows scientists to put the "knockout" procedure to work; the developing mice are injected with additional cells that have been manipulated in culture so that existing functions are "knocked out." This

enables researchers to identify specific gene functions and analyze how the knocked-out gene's inactivation affects the entire organism.

"We're really excited about what we can do with this new mouse model. No other available transgenics offer the same opportunities for gene therapy and analysis," Schmidt continued. "We've been able to demonstrate that we can transfer the expressive genes in lymphocytes taken directly from our transgenic animals, which gives us a unique opportunity to study gene function and ultimately correct genetic defects."

Two papers on the project are currently being prepared for publication, according to Schmidt.

Ascending to New Heights: The Hudson Hoagland Society



Named to honor the memory of the co-founder of the Worcester Foundation for Biomedical Research, the Hudson Hoagland Society recognizes individuals who make yearly leadership gifts of \$1,000 or more to the Foundation's Annual Research Fund. Rockwell, this society of individuals committed to assisting the Foundation with its biomedical research mission, added 23 new members in the last year, bringing total membership to nearly 200 from around the world.

On June 9, Peter Hillary, a member of one of the most famous adventuring families of the century, addressed the 14th annual meeting of the Hudson Hoagland Society. Hillary made international news in 1999 when he and two companions made the first-ever ascent of the Shackelton Glacier, establishing a new route to the South Pole.

In November, members of the Society attended a talk by John L. Sullivan, MD, renowned AIDS researcher and director of the UMMS Office for Research, discussing his hope that there will be an AIDS vaccine available within the next decade. Dr. Sullivan also reported on nevaripine drug trials taking place in South Africa that are helping curb the rate of AIDS transmissions from mothers to their babies.

Driving Research: The Worcester Foundation Auxiliary



The Worcester Foundation Auxiliary continued its 52-year tradition in 1999 of building community support for the Worcester Foundation's missions of research and education. The group's primary


